















Threats to validity

Internal validity

- Not fully disjoint areas and topics
- Association of a problem to a topic/ area depends on the subject

External validity

- Only technical universities \rightarrow NCS group may not be comparable
- Groups have different sizes (52 CS, 80NCS)

Reproducability

Problem and solution labeling process

Conclusion



Survey to collect problems and solutions of women in research in Germany

Between the groups

- Distribution of problems across the area are similar
- CS solved 34% of their problems (NCS only 23%)
- CS report more equality issues (CS 11.2%, NCS 6.4%)

Most described:

- Problems: Parenting and Family plans
- Solutions: Help from others, workaround, strengthen self-esteem
