



Our Impact in Scotland

- Key partnerships: Open University Scotland, Glasgow Caledonian University, Fife College, Edinburgh Napier University, New College Lanarkshire, University of the Highlands & Islands (UHI).
- Women do Cyber: Partnership between Cisco, Glasgow Caledonian University, and Scotland Women in Technology. Secured funding from the Scottish government to take a cohort of unemployed and underemployed women in Scotland through the CyberOps Associate.
- Police Scotland: The Network Academy for UK Law Enforcement was established in 2020 by Sergeant Ashley Beck. The Academy is used to is used to upskill the IT workforce and boost cyber resiliency in Police in Police Scotland, and additionally to train young adults through the through the Police Scotland Youth Volunteers (PSYV) programme.

- To address this challenge, we secured Cisco CDA funding to run a series of bespoke training bootcamps for female students in the UK aged 13-19
 - > Cybersecurity training
 - Female cybersecurity experts to support
- We will be conducting and publishing research on how to boost gender parity in STEM subjects and careers
 Also through DevNetSkills cohorts




